April Event Recap

On April 18, 2013, sixteen young professionals came together to hear about Ralph Kurth's experiences working overseas. Ralph is President and CEO of Teshmont Consultants LP. Teshmont is recognized worldwide for their HVDC expertise and have provided services to clients around the world.

Ralph began his career at Teshmont as a summer student and, upon full time employment, was given the exciting opportunity to work in China. Teshmont was involved in a Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) contract from 1986-1996, which comprised of a long range generation and transmission plan for China. This comprehensive study covered all provinces across China. Ralph was in charge of developing a database application for the project to house the massive amounts of data required to undertake the multi-year study.

Ralph was also involved in a 300 MW HVDC interconnection between Thailand and Malaysia. Teshmont was the owner's engineer for the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT) and TNB, Malaysia's main energy provider. This project consisted of system studies to determine ratings and develop high level design. Ralph also spent time in Germany conducting equipment testing with the supplier Siemens, and was also on site in Malaysia as the commissioning supervisor to monitor testing of the equipment, subsystems and ultimate overall system.

The YPs not only found the projects that Ralph was involved with extremely interesting, but also enjoyed Ralph's personal accounts of living and working abroad. His pictures and stories of his family's experiences were captivating. Although there were challenges with the projects and cultural differences, Ralph gained skills and experiences that he still uses today. He let the YPs know that stepping outside our comfort zone can be rewarding in many ways!

Over the past several months, the Association has been very active on a number of fronts.

The 2013 AGM and Golf Tournament are scheduled for Monday May 13, 2013 at the Niakwa Country Club. This year is our 35th anniversary, so invite your co-workers, clients, and contractors! The AGM is not only a chance for each member to hear about the activities of our association over the past year, but also a great opportunity to voice your opinions and network with fellow members. The Energy, Science and Technology Committee hosted the annual Energy Reception at the Winnipeg Convention Centre. There was an informative presentation from the President of Manitoba Hydro, Mr. Scott Thompson, followed by a presentation on Climate Change. A very successful networking evening followed. The Image Committee continues to work with the University of Manitoba to complete the planning and construction of the "ACEC Manitoba Legacy Wall".

During the past month, the ACEC Manitoba Board of Directors and the APEGM Board met to discuss issues of common concern. ACEC Manitoba has provided APEGM with a board representative on APEGM's Image Committee, and we continue to strengthen ties to APEGM by formalizing an arrangement where an APEGM representative will attend ACEC board meetings several times a year.

Since my last report, ACEC Manitoba has hosted a number of additional Professional Development Sessions. These sessions have been well attended, and I believe they are a valuable resource for our members.

ACEC Manitoba Board Representatives and representatives of the Manitoba Association of Architects (MAA) Board met to discuss a number of common issues. Several areas of cooperation were identified for future discussion. MAA and ACEC Manitoba also cooperated in preparing a joint letter to Manitoba Health, which resulted in a significant change in a recent RFP issued by Manitoba Health. These changes were a direct result of the joint letter and resulted in a more fair and balanced RFP being issued.

As my term as President draws to an end in May, it is appropriate for me to reflect on the time I have spent representing your Association. The efforts of volunteers and members over past twelve months have resulted in a stronger voice for consulting engineering companies in Manitoba. This voice has been used to advance both the image of engineering and our future place at various decision making organizations in Manitoba. A strong Engineering Industry is an absolute necessity for the continued prosperity of our province, and all Manitobans.

In the last few months, we have pushed to create an understanding with the provincial government that the current state of the Limitation of Actions legislation in Manitoba has a damaging effect to the Manitoba Economy. Manitoba's position on the Limitation of Actions is out of step with not only the rest of Canada, but most of North America. ACEC Manitoba will cooperate with other interested associations as well as the Government of Manitoba to address this vital issue.

ACEC Manitoba will also continue to support the efforts of the University of Manitoba Engineering Department in seeking innovative ways to increase the relevancy and focus of engineering programs offered at the University. The Dean and staff of the faculty have made great efforts to set up programs that address our industry's concerns, and it is now up to us to work with them to make these programs work for all of us.

In closing, I am proud to report the progress your association is making, and encourage you to become an active participant in ACEC Manitoba.
